SOURCES FOR HAMMERSMITH AND FULHAM AT LONDON METROPOLITAN ARCHIVES

London Metropolitan Archives holds wide-ranging and extensive sources for the area covered by the present London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham. These date from 1391 until the present day and include extensive graphic collections and some audio visual material, as well as more traditional archives. A search on Hammersmith in our electronic cataloguing database finds 5077 entries, and a search on Fulham 5112, of which several examples are given below.
